Corwen Community Garden – An update

With the summer coming to a close, we'd like to thank all the volunteers for their help in the community garden, and there is still plenty to do over the winter months! There has been lots of fruit and veg to harvest over the last few weeks, with huge swedes, strawberries and long runner beans. The tomato plants are also coming along nicely and should soon be ready! Besides harvesting, our volunteers have been busy keeping on top of weeding and watering the planters, while being rewarded with fresh produce.

The Nature for Health team has been running lots of events in the garden, including the forage and feast session with plenty of good food made, using the garden's produce. Our light gardening sessions will continue over the winter months, so come down and have a chat, a cuppa and learn a few things about gardening (or teach us a thing or two!)





Scything and Drystone Walling

With the help of the Little Learning Company, we have been able to run scything and drystone walling sessions. It gave volunteers the opportunity to pick up some handy new skills while taking part in outdoor activities.

The scything events took place in Dôl Llangar and Corwen Community Orchard, with our instructor Phil and lasted two days at each site. The course offered an introduction to scything, which taught volunteers how to set up their scythe, sharpening methods and the basic scything technique. Huge thanks to the volunteers for helping to cut and collect the wildflower meadows, helping to ensure it will grow back more diverse than before.

Our drystone walling courses enabled volunteers to get to grips with the basics and put their skills to use rebuilding old walls in Coed Pen y Pigyn and on Caer Drewyn Iron Age Hillfort. Both walls had deteriorated significantly over many years. The walls have since been restored and are now in much better shape.

Himalayan Balsam Bashing

Our volunteers have been getting involved in the bashing of Himalayan Balsam, which is a non-native, invasive species, and can become a problem as it easily spreads between riverbanks, gardens, and waste areas. The plant species will quickly outcompete other species, due to its low light tolerability.

Bashing is the process of uprooting the roots of the plant, and snapping it in multiple places, which makes for quite a satisfying job! Volunteer sessions have taken place over the summer at Ty Mawr and the Llangollen Old Railway. A big thank you to everyone that attended!
